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## Question: 1

Which of the following are complementary angles?

- A.  $71^\circ$  and  $19^\circ$
- B.  $18^\circ$  and  $18^\circ$
- C.  $90^\circ$  and  $90^\circ$
- D.  $90^\circ$  and  $45^\circ$
- E.  $15^\circ$  and  $30^\circ$

**Answer: A**

Explanation:

Complementary angles are two angles that add to  $90^\circ$ .

## Question: 2

A man decided to buy new furniture from Futuristic Furniture for \$2600. Futuristic Furniture gave the man two choices: pay the entire amount in one payment with cash, or pay \$1000 as a down payment and \$120 per month for two full years in the financial plan. If the man chooses the financial plan, how much more would he pay?

- A. \$1480 more
- B. \$1280 more
- C. \$1600 more
- D. \$2480 more
- E. \$3720 more

**Answer: B**

Explanation:

Multiply \$120 by 24 months (a full two years) to get \$2880. Add the thousand dollars for the down payment to get \$3880. Find the difference between the entire amount all at once (\$2600) and the amount paid in the plan (\$3880). To find the difference, you subtract. The difference shows that \$1280 more is paid with the installment plan.

## Question: 3

If 35% of a paycheck was deducted for taxes and 4% for insurance, what is the total percentage taken out of the paycheck?

- A. 20%
- B. 31%
- C. 39%
- D. 42%
- E. 48%

**Answer: C**

Explanation:

To solve, find the sum.  $35\% + 4\% = 39\%$

### Question: 4

As used in this passage, the word "parasite" means

- A. a person who lives in Paris
- B. an organism that live on or in another organism
- C. microscopic insects
- D. a person who takes advantage of the generosity of others

**Answer: B**

Explanation:

As used in this passage, the word "parasite" means an organism that lives on or in another organism, Choice B. Choice A and C are obviously wrong, since the passage mentions nothing of Paris or insects. Choice D is another definition for "parasite," but does not fit the context of the word used in this passage.

### Question: 5

According to the passage, adult Roundworms can live in

- A. the arthropod vector
- B. fecal matter
- C. the subcutaneous tissue of humans
- D. contaminated water

**Answer: C**

Explanation:

According to the description of Roundworms, they can live in the subcutaneous tissue of humans, Choice C. Choices A, B, and D describe where protozoa live and how they are transmitted.

### Question: 6

You can infer from this passage that

- A. larval stages of parasites are more dangerous than the adult forms
- B. mosquitoes do not transmit parasites
- C. worms cannot infect humans
- D. clean sanitary conditions will keep you free of protozoa

**Answer: D**

Explanation:

According to the first paragraph, protozoa are transmitted through food and water contaminated by fecal matter. It can then be inferred that clean sanitary conditions will prevent the spread of protozoa, Choice D. Choice A is an incorrect inference because the passage discusses both larval and adult forms of parasites that infect humans. Choice B is an incorrect inference, since the first paragraph states that protozoa are transmitted by mosquitoes. Choice C is an incorrect inference because the second paragraph is about worms that infect humans.

### Question: 7

According to the passage, which of the following is true?

- 1. Protozoa live in the blood or tissue of humans. II. Adult helminthes cannot reproduce in humans.
- III. Adult thorny-headed worms live in the intestinal tract.

- A. I only
- B. II only
- C. I and II only
- D. I, II, and III

**Answer: D**

Explanation:

To answer this question, you will need to verify all three statements in the passage. All three of these statements are true and are supported by the passage.

### Question: 8

The author wrote this passage to

- A. tell about the Declaration of Independence
- B. encourage the reader to watch movies about America's independence
- C. give the reader the history of an American holiday
- D. explain why America's independence from Britain is taken for granted

**Answer: C**

Explanation:

This passage was written to give the reader the history of the American holiday, the Fourth of July, Choice C. With regard to Choice A, the Declaration of Independence is mentioned in the passage, but the main purpose of the passage does not focus on it. The same is true for Choice B. The passage does talk about movies associated with the Fourth of July, but the main purpose of the passage is not to encourage the reader to watch those movies. In Choice D, the passage does mention that independence from Britain is taken for granted, but the passage does not explain why.

### Question: 9

This passage is primarily about

- A. the most important nonreligious holiday in America
- B. how the Fourth of July did not become a tradition until after the War of 1812
- C. how Americans will always protect their independence
- D. how the Fourth of July no longer makes people think about independence from Britain

**Answer: A**

Explanation:

This passage is primarily about the most popular American holiday, the Fourth of July, Choice A. The passage does relate to some extent to the other choices, but these do not reflect the main idea of the passage.

### Question: 10

According to the passage, when did Americans first begin celebrating the Fourth of July?

- A. Immediately after signing the Declaration of Independence
- B. After the War of 1812
- C. In the 1870s
- D. Two hundred years after the Declaration of Independence was signed

**Answer: B**

Explanation:

This detailed question offers four time periods mentioned in the passage as possible answer choices. Use caution when choosing the answer. Look back at the passage. The end of paragraph one offers the correct choice, Choice B.

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
