Explanation:

Question: 4

Question: 5

Which mode of writing is most suitable for the purpose of encouraging the reading audience to explore ideas and consider various potential associated responses?

Answer: D

Explanation:

The purpose of narrative (a) writing is storytelling. Even when authors want to afford insights and/or teach lessons as well as entertain readers, they accomplish their purposes through storytelling. The purposes of expository (b) writing are to inform, explain, and/or direct readers.

The purpose of persuasive (c) writing is to convince readers to believe or agree with the author's position and/or argument. The purpose of speculative (d) writing is to encourage readers to explore ideas and potential responses rather than entertain, tell stories, inform, explain, direct, or convince.

Question: 6

Calvin's mordant comment about his sister's weight just as she was biting into the piece of cake cast a cloud over the birthday celebrations.

Which of the following is the definition for the underlined word in the sentence above?

- A. timely
- B. biting
- C. concerned
- D. effective

Answer: B

Explanation:

The context of the sentence indicates that Calvin's comment is anything but kind, so the closest adjective in this case is biting. There is nothing timely about his comment, at least in the sense of it being appropriate, so answer choice A is incorrect. The context does not indicate that Calvin is concerned so much as critical, so answer choice C is incorrect. And the sentence in no way indicates that Calvin's remark is effective, so answer choice D is incorrect.

Question: 7

Why is it important to consult more than one source while researching a topic?

Answer: B

Explanation:

Although consulting more than one source may give you different ideas of how to word your argument or show that many different ways to look at an issue, these reasons are not quite as important as validating and dismissing information.

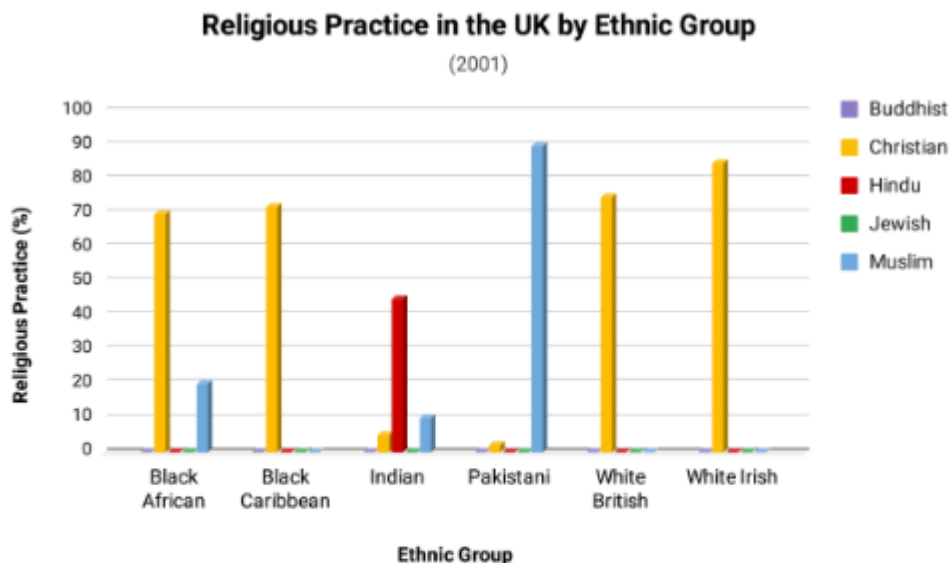

Question: 9

Explanation:

The chart indicates that, as a combined percentage based on population numbers, Christianity was most practiced in the United Kingdom. While there are four ethnic groups that practice Christianity as a primary religion (white British, white Irish, black Caribbean, and black African), the population of three of these ethnic groups is fairly small. It is the white British population, and the fact that more than 70% of this population practices Christianity, that made Christianity the primary religion in the United Kingdom.

Question: 10

According to the charts, which two religions listed on the chart are practiced the least?

- A. Islam and Hinduism
- B. Judaism and Buddhism
- C. Buddhism and Hinduism
- D. Hinduism and Judaism

Answer: B

Explanation:

Judaism and Buddhism represent the lowest percentage of practice in the United Kingdom, so answer choice B is correct. Among the various ethnic groups, the percent of practitioners in each of these religions is less than 1 percent. Answer choice A is incorrect, because Islam and Hinduism could be considered the second and third most practiced religions on the United Kingdom. The presence of Hinduism in answer choices C and D means that both of these answer choices cannot be correct.

Question: 11

Which of the following statements would be LEAST relevant in a formal essay about artist Salvador Dali?

- A. Although his works are famed for their dream-like qualities, Dali executed them with realism reminiscent of the Renaissance masters.
